### **Lands & Environment Report**

The year 2000 was a busy one. Our biggest and most important battle was preventing our Provincial Government from converting Kananaskis Country into a Provincial Park. Our recommendations for the new Spray Valley Provincial Park were only partially adopted. We saved one half the proposed area and had it designated as a Wildland Park, but lost out on our proposed boundary designations for this area. As a result we have lost the most important traditional sheep hunting area in Alberta to a Provincial Park where commercial development is a permitted use, but hunting is not.

Now we have a new problem. The Ministry is in the process of creating another Provincial Park in Kananaskis country, the Evan-Thomas which will border the Spray Valley on the

east. This will happen, but we want to be involved with the planning process relating to boundaries. We again were not invited to participate. We have therefore prepared a presentation on behalf of Alberta Fish and Game to be submitted on Jan. 10th. We want to be represented on the Evan-Thomas committee of the Environment Dept. We are the only organization able to represent the hunters and anglers of the province.

We are continuing as interveners in the use of herbicides in the forest industry and will keep members informed.

Many thanks to Bob Everett who had done much on this committee particularly with Calgary Park & River Valleys, Also to Yves Ouellette who is back on the committee and to Dave McIver who has joined us for 2001.

As in previous years there will in addition to the draw for the three rifles be a draw for the benefit of those who contributed to our club program ( a prize for every 100 hides). I'm not sure what the prizes will be this year. In the past. we have had knives. This draw will take place at the conclusion of the Hide Collection program in late January. ## **BIRD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

### ***PHEASANT RAISING & RELEASING PROJECT FOR 2000.***

We had another VERY SUCCESSFUL year! Sarcee F&G paid for 515 6 - week old pheasant chicks which were reimbursed by ACA. We got 530 chicks that we raised in 6 locations. Our mortality rate was minimal. We are over-wintering about 10 birds. ALL the rest have been released, mostly by the "open-pen-door" method. We released pheasants in 16 different places. Early reports had the birds spreading out nicely, so now all we can do is hope for the best.

Personally, and from Sarcee Fish & Game, a very sincere THANK YOU to all 6 pheasant raisers: DAN HILL; RICK TAMS and FAMILY; DAN RADOMSKA and PEG BAYNES; TOM BEYER; LEROY HUETHER, and MARGE and DOUG FRASER. Your daily watering, feeding and caring/nurturing was absolutely ESSENTIAL for the success of this project. Most of us city folk have a very poor understanding of the commitment that you make, just because you "Like to see the birds around". Thank you very much.

In addition, we got over 160 "brooder hens" from the Canadian Pheasant Co. (previously the Brooks Pheasant Hatchery), that we released in 20 different locations. The release ratio was usually 1 rooster to 7 hens although some land owners with roosters around wanted only hens. We had some reports of good survival.

Thank you to the Canadian Pheasant Company for donating 25 roosters to our second Youth Pheasant Shoot on Oct. 28. It was really appreciated.

Thank you to John Komonoski for all his help and counsel. And thank you to all the other members and people who helped, and those who volunteered to help but were not used. I appreciate your offer to help and regret that we did not use everyone. (But I still have your names available.) Special thanks to Dan Radomske for everything. I really do appreciate the "living on the land " reality check.

On a positive note, at ALL 4 LOCATIONS where we raised and released pheasants in 1999, there was at least one HATCH of pheasant chicks reported in 2000. A Fantastic start!

A great benefit of this pheasant project is the friendships, goodwill and cooperation that we have encountered in many areas. There are a lot of people who want to see more pheasants out there, and who are willing to help make it happen. It has been a pleasure to give out Habitat Stewards. And Sarcee has a number of new rural members. It has been SUPER!

### ***BIRD HUNTING.***

The Opening Weekend Pheasant Derby and the Annual Pheasant Derby Trophy was won by Dave McIver with his entry of 36 3/4 inches. All the other Annual Bird competitions, with beautiful trophies, will close at the Trophy Measuring Night on Jan. 26, 2001. Or you can submit the entries to me at the Jan. 9th General Meeting. The Annual competitions are for the longest pheasant; and for the heaviest Mallard Duck, Canada Goose, Snow Goose, and White-Fronted Goose. This is a participation event, so please enter.

This was a "mixed" bird hunting season for me. We had moderate success but there are lots of stories to tell when you renew your SF&G membership with me. I thank Art Beck and Dave McIver for inviting me on the Best end-of-year goose and duck shoot that I have ever had. See you on Jan. 26.

### ***PLANS FOR 2001.***

First, thanks Dan Radomske for agreeing to be my Northern Assistant. This should cut down some of our travel, and it is great to have the real expert on the list. Thanks also to the Club for electing me as Bird Chairman again.

We will try to expand our pheasant program to 600 birds. We will ask the club to expand our Predator Bounty program also. If you have any concerns or comments about the predator bounty, please call ME at 249-7245, or Dan Radomske at (403) 227-2105.

### **Do you or a family member qualify for AFGA Scholarship?**

Check this CRITERIA FOR SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY and get a complete application form from John Hunter or Mary Lynn Brown. The deadline for applying is Feb 28, 2001.

1. The applicant must be enrolled in a minimum one-year environmental sciences or related program at an accredited Alberta post-secondary institution.
2. The applicant or their parent must be a member of the Alberta Fish and Game Association or an affiliated fish and game club.
3. The applicant will not be paid directly; the scholarship will be paid to the educational institution in the student's name upon acceptance into the program.
4. The applicant must be 21 years of age or younger as of January 1st of the year the scholarship is awarded.
5. It is the intention of the Alberta Fish and Game Association (AFGA) to award one scholarship of \$500.00 per year. If a suitable recipient is not found in any given year, the scholarship will not be awarded that year, but rather, carried over to the next year when two will be issued if suitable applications are submitted.
6. An outline of the program and all course requirements are to be sent with the application form to the AFGA office. Proof of acceptance to the program must be submitted to the AFGA office prior to the scholarship funds being forwarded to the educational institution.
7. The scholarship will not necessarily go to the student applying with the highest grades. Past experience and involvement with the **Alberta Fish** and Game Association or other related-interest organizations (ie. Junior Forest Wardens, Scouts, etc.) will be given great consideration.
8. Candidates are asked to submit a minimum 500 word essay to the Alberta Fish and Game Association outlining why they should be chosen and future goals. The essay should include information on any involvement with AFGA, or other clubs or organizations which are involved in maintenance of wildlife habitat, outdoor and firearms education (ie. Hunter Education Firearms Safety, Scouts, Cadets, etc.)
9. Financial need will be a consideration
10. A phone interview of the top five applicants will be conducted in March by a judging panel.
11. The chosen scholarship recipient will be notified prior to April 1, 2001. A presentation will be made to the winner at the Alberta Fish and Game Association's Alberta Wildlife Awards Dinner in April. It is recommended that the recipient attend.

### **TREASURER COMMENTS**

In the past outdoor sports people and clubs have tended to be political neutral, the lack of action on our part is being more evident, as vocal special interest groups are getting their way, mainly because our politically neutral stance has left our side unheard.

Three times western Canada has said "We want in" and three times the rest of Canada has rejected us. It is time to make our Provincial Government aware that we are not happy with Ottawa's direction. Alberta can shield itself from the undesirable effect of Ottawa if we as citizens make a point of being heard by our politicians. Your letters do make a difference. Now with communication so easy electronically, a had written letter carries a lot of weight. Ticked off with C-68? Tell Klein not to allow the conservation officers to check for gun licenses, tell Klein to get rid of the RCMP and employ a provincial police force as does Ontario and Quebec, tell Klein to enact the not withstanding clause for Bill C-68. Ticked off at the money grab the feds make of our transfer payments, tell Klein to establish our own tax collection system (as Quebec has) and collect all back payments that Ottawa stole from us and charge Ottawa for the cost of doing so. Ticked off at how the province is allotting some of the best hunting area into park... tell Klein....make your views known because silence is allowing uncontested choices being forced on us. Also write your MLA, if unsure who your MLA is, phone 310-0000, give your address and they will tell you.
