## LANDS & ENVIRONMENT REPORT

I attended the recent 2001 AFGA Annual Conference in Lethbridge and must congratulate zone 1, our hosts for an excellent performance. Some highlights are as follows:

- a) Gerry Pittman continues as president for another year.
- b) Quentin Bocher, Environmental Chair, was replaced by Ruth Harrison from Leduc. The new executive will be listed in the next Outdoor Edge.
- c) Environment Minister Halvar Jonson, a conference guest speaker, reported under questioning that his department and the agriculture minister have been working to develop a new protocol in regard to game farming as a result of chronic wasting disease found in elk farms in Saskatchewan and Colorado. We were assured that no game farm elk would be allowed to enter Alberta in the foreseeable future. This is a very serious issue. He also reconfirmed that the hunting of game farm animals on game farms or enclosed hunting areas would not be permitted. As well, there are no plans to close the grizzly bear hunting season in Alberta, as has happened in B.C. due to pressure from anti-hunting groups.

More convention reports will be forthcoming.

At our last meeting we had Trevor Rhodes, Fisheries Biologist for the lower Bow River ask for our assistance in a tagging program of rainbow trout at the confluence of the Bow and Highwood to determine the mortality and impacts of spawning success caused by catch and release angling during the spring spawn. Volunteers are required for the tagging and for the capture of these fish by angling and non-angling techniques. This will all happen in April. ### **Habitat News**

#### **2000 Hide Collection Review**

During and following the 2000 hunting season 561 hides were donated to the Alberta Wildlife Trust Hide Collection Program. Of these 492 were deer, 33 moose and 36 elk hides. As a result the Trust should receive approximately \$3000.00.

Each hide donated earned an entry in the province-wide draw for three scope equipped hunting rifles. The draw for these rifles took place at the recent AFGA convention in Lethbridge. The winners of the draw were: Steve Bagshaw of Castor, Cory Kulich of Lethbridge and Bernie Beaumont of Provost. I had hoped that we might repeat our performance of a few years ago when two of the three rifles went to hunters who had contributed to our program. However, because we collected over 500 hides we have five MAXAM -Extra Heavy Duty Lockback Knives for which we have drawn the five following names of those who contributed. They are the following;

*Kevin Stewart, Jim Prescott, Rock Heintz, Wilson Demsdale and Brent Mainwood.* Hopefully all these winners will have their knives by the time this goes to press.

Sincere thanks go to our hide collectors who made our program the most successful of all the clubs in the province, I believe. They are: Bob and Laurel Everett, Art and Lynn Martens, Blaine and Marion McGrath, Mark and Sonia Jobson, John Hunter and my wife Merle. The Shed Antler Program which provided at least a dozen prizes the first of which was a muzzle-loading rifle, were drawn for at the annual convention. We unfortunately had only three entrees. Two fellows who contributed a goodly number of sheds won three and seven prizes respectively. **THIS IS AN EXCELLENT FUND RAISER FOR THE TRUST AND THERE ARE SOME GREAT PRIZES.** Every antler earns an entry, but they must be "shed antlers". If you have sheds please contact Bryce Chase at 249-6924. If you haven't any, the Springtime is the best season to go looking for them.

#### **Nesting Boxes**

## **BIRD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

**Here we go --Again!** I am looking forward to another Exciting year of pheasant raising and releasing. The club has approved my budget, and we have contacted all the pheasant raisers from last year. Dan Hill has moved so that spot is gone. The Tams are considering all their options, so that place is undecided. However, we had 11 new expression of interest to raise and release pheasants from the Calgary Boat & Sportsmen's Show.(CB&SS) We will check them out, along with 3 from last year. There is much interest out there in "more pheasants". At this time, we are fairly certain of 2 new pheasant pens for 25 and 50 pheasants without pen construction..

I was wondering what our major lessons will be this year. In 2000 we had two examples of roosters killing hens when the "Ratio" was wrong, and we twice learned that skunks can dig and get into pens through small holes. We also learned that raising pheasants in 6 different places is much better than one place in regard to hail storms and predators. Our mortality was about 20 birds from 530 chicks. One of the exciting things about this project is the "learning".

Thanks to Dan Radomske & Peg Bayne for bringing "Hubert" down to the CB&SS. Hubert their "tame" rooster pheasant, was very well behaved, mild mannered, the star of the show. I understand that Hubert has been offered a lucrative contract to go on tour with Ed Houck of the Canadian Pheasant company.

The "Alberta Junior Pheasant Project" purposed by Dan Radomske would see us raising, 1,000 birds to be released @ 100 per week starting in mid September. Dan & I had a short meeting with Pheasants Forever and NFA who are very interested in promoting more young hunters. Gery Kemp of "Hunting for TOMORROW" (HFT) is also very keen. We are planning a bigger meeting involving Tom Mathews, AHEIA, the Bowden Institute and others. This is an Exciting idea which could involve about 150 youths/ First time hunters per year. AWESOME Dan! We will keep you informed as it evolves.

### **Art Yeske's Report on the 72nd Annual AF&GA Conference Feb. 22-24, 2001, Lethbridge AB.**

Deb Clarke, the Zone I Conference Coordinator, did a fabulous job of organizing and running this conference for AF&GA. It was very busy, but everything was in one room so we all heard the same speakers. The presentations by the Sr. Executives, Zone Chairmen, Committee Chairs, and the Office Staff were all great. It was good to see them all introduced and recognized. We are going Forward!

To me, one of the best presentations was Andrew Schoepf's "Managing Public Wildlife on Private Lands". He stressed we Must continue to work with individual landowners in such programs as Habitat Stewards and Parkland Stewardship Programs (PSP) and we must stress to landowners the great significance of their land for habitat. We need cooperative programs and must Recognize them and thank them for being Volunteers. Communication is an important two-way street, and most farmers "know a hell of a lot" about their land.

Maurice Nadeau, the Hunting Chair, gave a very thoughtful and balanced presentation and urged us to send more letters, phone calls and e-mails to 1; & W and AF&GA and to send copies to him. He stressed the importance of the "First Time Hunter" program and urged clubs to get involved. In this regard, I met Gerry Kemp, the Program Manager of Hunting For Tomorrow (HFT). He suggested that I write a letter requesting that Sarcee F&G be allowed to sit on this committee/foundation. Gerry was very interested in Dan Radomske's proposed "Alberta Junior Pheasant Project". we have a tentative meeting set up on this, and we will be inviting PF, NFA, ACA, HFT, AHEIA, the Can. Pheasant Company, and Corrections Canada (Bowden Institute). You will hear more about this exciting project as it happens.

At the President's Banquet, I was honoured and pleased that Sarcee Fish & Game won the Darwin Cronkhite Award for "the best job in bird rejuvenation" for our pheasant raising and releasing project. Sarcee also won three other awards including the Denis Hindbo Predator Control Trophy which had major support from our pheasant raisers. Thanks Bryce for sending them all in.
