I'm pleased with the selection of my executive and committee chair people who are the do'ers of this association. I am some what concerned that out of more than seven hundred members we were unable to fill all committee chairs at our annual general meeting. I suppose it's an attitude, "if someone else will do it, why bother to get involved." Well, if I had such an attitude I wouldn't be your president. So attend some of our meetings and see for yourself what a pleasant and dedicated group we are.

This year will not be dull. There are problems relating to hunters and anglers costs, sustain ability of the resource, disease from game farms and the lack of government support which will be dealt with. We must remain alert and ready to oppose initiatives by anti hunters, costly gun control, penned hunting and other activities that make those things we enjoy more difficult. Of major importance is the concern that 58% to 73% of your license fees go to the Alberta Conservation Association, but this money is not being returned to wildlife in the manner for which it was intended, but supports a very large staff and other non participating groups.

On a more pleasant note, we do have some great things happenings, such as our banquet March 16, 2002, casino April 3 & 4, 2002, sportsman show Feb. 15 - 18, 2002 and much more. Spring is coming, "Keep a Tight Line".

2002 TROPHY MEASURING NIGHT

The annual Sarcee Fish and Game Association Trophy Measuring night will be held on Friday January 25th, 2002 at the Glamorgan Community Center, located at 4207 41st Avenue SW. Admission is \$5.00. Doors open at 7:00 PM and trophies will be scored on a first come first served basis. The competition is open only to members possessing current trophies (taken during the 2001 hunting season). There is also an archery and a youth competition. Members who have trophies that were taken outside of Alberta may enter them in a separate category, where they will compete against other out of province trophies on a percentage basis. Both non-current and non-member trophies are also welcome and will be scored. Due to time constraints, Sarcee Fish and Game may not be able to score some extremely complex trophies such as Caribou. Arrangements can be made to have these trophies scored prior to trophy measuring night. If you have a previously scored trophy that you would like to display, feel free to bring it, along with the score sheet.

To ensure that our annual trophy measuring night runs smoothly, we require about 40 volunteers to help set up tables, sell tickets, register trophies, score trophies, etc. All volunteers receive free admission, a free drink ticket, and get first crack at the buffet table. Please call me at (403) 874-3022 if you are interested. We are also in need of volunteers to help prepare the buffet, as well as game sausage and other food donations. NEWSLETTER

There have been questions about why so much talk about sending the newsletter by email. For people who have computers and use email or would like to increase their computer knowledge getting the newsletter by email eliminates a lot of the cost and effort. The newsletter is email by printing the newsletter to the format created by the Adobe Acrobat Reader, a quick check of layout and then by sending the newsletter to John Hunter with a BLIND CARBON COPY to the list of others wanting the newsletter, the newsletter is done for these people. Each time I email the newsletter I update my virus scanner, run virus scanner on the newsletter and update any changes to the email address. For the people who receive their newsletter by mail the process is just started. The newsletter is sent to the professional printer while I email the newsletter out. By that point the envelopes have had the return address stamped on, the label of the address attached and are waiting for the newsletter. Once the newsletter is back from the printer the stuffing begins, this newsletter will have individual letters that must be put in the correct envelop, a complementary copy of Point Blank (NFA will pay the postage for mailing the Point Blank and envelopes), the newsletter and if you will sell the raffle tickets then we add a letter and the number of books of tickets requested (while recording the number of tickets on the raffle seller list). Once the envelopes are stuffed they then need to be sealed and stamped. At this point I believe we will have 5 or more postage rates. 1. Newsletter & Point Blank 2. Newsletter, Point Blank & one book of raffle tickets. 3. Newsletter, Point Blank & two books of ticket, you get the idea and we have people willing to take 10 books of tickets. The email people will get the raffle tickets mailed and the Point Blank (as now too big of file to email). Remember that we are handling more than 370 envelopes for this addition. As you can see from the man hours and the cost, the email newsletter is faster and cost is not dependent on the number of pages or number of people receiving it. The list of people accepting the Newsletter by Email is over 60 people and is growing. If you would like to receive your newsletter by email, please email your address to sfgabrown@cadvision.com. The process to read the newsletter is not hard and I can supply you with information to help you. Hope this helps you understand why we encourage members to take the newsletter by email.

WILDLIFE TRUST HIDE AND SHED ANTLER COLLECTION PROGRAM

To date we have shipped 370 deer, 33 Moose and 9 elk hides. In addition as of December 29 we have about 80 more to go and I'm sure there will be more to come. Check with friends and acquaintances and be sure that we get as many as possible. Far too many hides are wasted.

On December 9 I delivered 83 Shed antlers to the AFGA office in Edmonton while up there to attend the annual meeting of the Wildlife Trust. Since then about a dozen more have come in. Look around your place and if you have "sheds" (antlers that have been dropped) think about donating them to our fund raising project for the purchase of land for Wildlife Habitat.

Alberta Junior Pheasant Project

Seasons Greetings,

We have completed the Junior Pheasant hunts for this season. The Volunteer response and sponsor support was very encouraging. We completed all 10 weekends without canceling one day. 76 kids age 12-17 participated with 4 younger one repeating to boost their confidence. The corn was baled up the day after followed by snow so the timing couldn't have been planned better. Mike Larner from Alberta Hunter Education was here to train our volunteers on Sept. 9 and Oct. 6 to provide a guideline on skills for our volunteers. Some of Alberta's best dog handlers took turns assisting the kids in their hunting.. Not everyone got a bird but this is hunting, not shopping and a 75-80% success rate is impressive. Every hunter had several good chances.

We fired off over 1500 round of 20 gauge ammo and several cases of clay birds. Activities covered were: Safe gun handling, patterning, skeet shooting, eye dominance, dog use, proper dress water and caloric need of man and dog, pheasant hunting, shooting zones, gun cleaning, bird cleaning, land owner respect, bird ID and provincial game bird regulations.

We released 50 pheasant on Saturday and 25 on Sunday. 92% are hens which has kept public hunters from bothering the reserve. 4 Turkeys were released per weekend and there are a dozen left in the farmyard at this time and others have been seen at other farms. A few Bobwhite and Chukars were in the yard for a while but they don't seem to be as tough as pheasants. We have repopulated birds for 5 miles in every direction.

It cost approx. \$120 per student to go through this program.. Some expense like the shed, crates and guns will not be needed next year. THANK YOU sponsor for making it FREE to the kids. Most kids wrote that they want to come back, but this is a beginner training program It was a very rewarding response.

Anyone who wants firearms safely in the hands of beginning hunters, please join our sponsor list in any way, big or small. We are forging ahead for 2002 helped by our new assistant, Wayne Price. Watch for our display at the booth at the Sportsmen's Show in Calgary in February.
